**The National Center for Reliable Electric Power Transmission within the Electrical Engineering** Department at the University of Arkansas invites applications for the position of **Managing Director** to begin in the Spring or Summer of 2008. At least ten years experience in the electric power industry is desired. Applicants are expected to have a degree in Electrical Engineering. NCREPT is home to a new state-of-the-art 6.5 MVA test facility and an impressive array of power electronic laboratories involving modeling and simulation, IC design, power electronics design, power electronic packaging, and test.

**Specific duties** include marketing the capabilities of NCREPT, recruiting new industrial partners to join the center, preparing center-related reports such as the NCREPT Annual Report, overseeing the scheduling and safe operation of the new 7000 ft<sup>2</sup> distribution test facility, working with the faculty directors and industrial advisory board to establish and fund new initiatives, and aiding NCREPT Executive Director managing the day-to-day operations of the center. Applicants are expected to have:

- At least a bachelor's degree in electrical engineering
- Minimum of 10 years experience working in the electric power industry
- Excellent oral and written communication skills
- Minimum of 10 years experience in personnel management
- Familiarity with IEEE power industry standards
